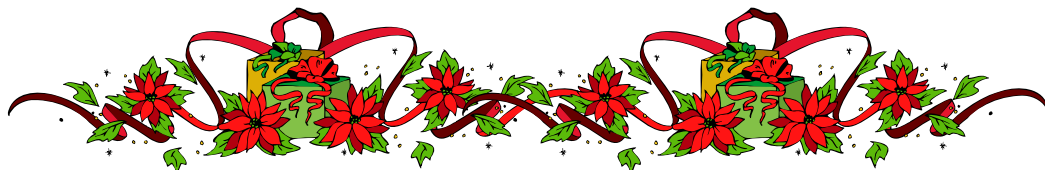

I was the Ohio winner for the NAAE "Teachers Turn The Key" award, presented to fifty agricultural educators across the United States, which allowed me the opportunity to attend the 2009 National Association of Agricultural Educators conference, held this past November in Nashville Tennessee.

While at the five-day convention I experienced tremendous personal development sessions, networked with other young ag teachers from the country, and was presented with resources such as free jump drives and lesson plans (including an awesome one for introductory biotechnology that my Ag I students will love).
